



# **Purple Loosestrife Update**

The Association made a commitment in 2009 to treat purple Loosestrife, an aggressive invasive plant, in the river corridor. This has been accomplished each year during several volunteer events usually held in August.

This year because of Covid 19, the decision was made to not have any events and ask property owners to cut plants when they have floated sections of the river. Several stretches were treated in this manner. Marie Harrington, David Smith, Howard Johnson, and Bob Johnson floated the Holy Water (Burton's Landing to Wakeley Bridge) and removed all the Purple Loosestrife they found. Harrington and Smith also removed plants around Mac's Island and a quarter mile downstream when they were called by an Association member asking for help.
